IV. Presentation – Trina Spencer - NAU	<p>Has been working with NACOG since 2011 with dual language learners in Head Start; if the research goes well it will go nationwide. Teachers facilitate lessons Trina has written and gives her feedback. IT is to help create a dual language curriculum to use in Head Start. (Handout) Puente de Cuentos (Bridge Made of Stories) start in Spanish then switch to English. There are 72 lessons (32 in each language) Across the units they learn 36 new words. The lessons integrate with the circle time so it includes all children in the class then it is integrated throughout the day, including small group work. They are targeting vocabulary, grammar and storytelling because these are the biggest predictor of reading comprehension later in life.</p> <p>How other grantees can get involved: they are doing a randomized control study. They need to do better with measuring vocabulary and family engagement. Contact Trina if interested.</p> <p>Margaret asked how they are going to measure vocabulary? It consists of teachers, parents, Family Support Specialists.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ They need to have people from grantees that serve their children on their committee.• Catholic Charities also implemented a School Readiness committee that also included community.• City of Phoenix is refining goals to implement the new Framework and State Standards.
