



The Arizona Cohort 2 Preschool Development Grant Birth-5 is slated to open February 2024!

In December 2022, Arizona was awarded the Preschool Development Grant Birth-5 (PDG B-5) Renewal Grant. This is a 3-year grant with a total of \$42 million in funding. Grant initiatives include increasing access to high quality early learning programs for children Birth-5 years old, building early childhood educator capacity, supporting family engagement, and increasing inclusive settings for children with disabilities.

The cost to attend this virtual event is \$45 per person, with discounts available for family members of children with disabilities and Early Intervention and Early Childhood Education Students currently enrolled at an institute of higher education.

The Early Intervention and Early Childhood Special Education Summit is an annual event cohosted by Arizona Department of Education's Exceptional Student Services Early Childhood Special Education Unit and the Department of Economic Security's Arizona Early Intervention Program. It is designed to present content related to supporting children with disabilities, ages 0-5, by bringing national speakers, state staff, and local practitioners together to share information about issues, challenges, successes, practices, and strategies to improve outcomes. This year, the Summit will take place over three days, with Day One focused on presenting the state of early childhood, the results, and the research around key issues. The following two days will be focused on evidencebased practices, supports, and successes. Day Two will highlight effective practices when working with children in early intervention. Day Three will showcase strategies and best practices when working with children in preschool settings. After you have enrolled, we will send you a link to the CVENT Conference platform, approximately 10 days before the event.

Attendance Works Arizona E-Learning Series

Learn proven, team-based strategies to promote attendance and student engagement in this highly-rated, three-part training series.

This opportunity is provided at no cost for administrators and educators at select schools/districts as part of Read On Arizona's strategic efforts to reduce rates of chronic absence in our state.



The Attendance Works Arizona E-Learning Series consists of three live, virtual 90-minutes sessions:

Session 1 Whole School Engagement Strategies for Reducing Student Absenteeism

Participants will learn how to work as a team to take a multi-tiered approach to improve attendance in their schools by drawing on whole school strategies to create positive conditions for learning and strong relationships with students and families that prevent absenteeism. Participants will be introduced to the framework of multi-tiered attendance strategies that moves schools towards prevention and early intervention and learn effective strategies to communicate with families about attendance.

Session 2 Early Intervention Strategies: Using Teams to Monitor and Identify Students in Need of Support Participants will learn which attendance measures to monitor in order to identify students in need of engagement and support. Participants will also learn about the key functions of a school team that addresses attendance and take stock of where they are in having a high-functioning team and gain understanding about the assets, barriers and strategies that affect attendance.

Session 3 Partnering to Make a Difference

Participants will learn strategies for mobilizing school staff and community agencies to partner with families to improve attendance and engagement and tools to determine if identified strategies and activities are making a difference.

Recordings of the live sessions will be available upon request for team members who miss a session, but active participation in each of the sessions is highly encouraged to maximize learning.




GIVE THE GIFT OF BOOKS!




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Participating ZIP Codes in Arizona, by County




