



Don't Delay When Your Child is Sick

Waiting too long, especially in a pandemic, can cause your child to become more ill unnecessarily. Pediatricians are open, safe and available to see your child.

Telemedicine allows your pediatrician to "see" your child using phone or video. Often many conditions including rashes, pink eye, behavior and mood issues, and allergies can be treated through telemedicine.
