Creating Solutions for Kids, Families and Communities

HEAD START was founded in 1965 as a national early education program based on the premise that every child, regardless of circumstances at birth, has the ability to reach their full potential. Together, Head Start

and Early Head Start (EHS) offer comprehensive, multi-generational, communitybased programs that provide health, nutrition, and family services to children from birth to age five and pregnant women. Working closely with local communities to identify and meet specific needs, Head Start promotes healthy, stable families and engages parents as equal partners in their child's education.

# Arizona Head Start Association

Led by a Director and volunteer Executive Committee, the Arizona Head Start Association (AZHSA) serves, unifies, and empowers the statewide coalition of organizations that provide Head Start/EHS programs. In addition to membership dues, funding for AZHSA studies, projects and training is provided by the Arizona Head Start State Collaboration Office through a grant from the Administration for Children and Families. AZHSA carries out its mission of advocacy, collaboration, and education through dedicated volunteers who lead four active committees:

- Disabilities & Mental Health
- Early Childhood Development
- Integrated Health and Safety
- Parent, Family and Community Engagement
