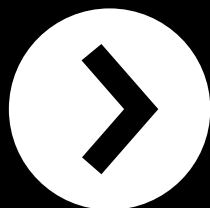

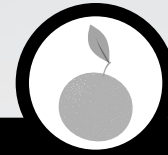
Nutrition Assistance Programs for Eligible Participants

By meeting the eligibility requirements for one program, participants are potentially eligible for others. This resource shows the various programs available and who may be eligible for each one.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

SNAP provides eligible households with monthly benefits they can use to purchase a variety of nutritious food. SNAP benefits can be used in a variety of stores.

Double Up Food Bucks

This program provides current SNAP participants an opportunity to receive additional fruits and vegetables. For every \$1 spent on eligible food items, participants receive \$1 to spend on Arizona-grown produce.

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

WIC provides nutrition education and breastfeeding support services, supplemental nutritious foods and referrals to health and social services. WIC serves pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women; infants; and children under the age of five.

School Nutrition Programs

These programs provide nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free breakfast and lunches to children each school day. Applications for free meals are provided by your child's school.

Child and Adult Care Food Program

This program provides reimbursements for nutritious meals and snacks served to eligible children/adults enrolled for care at participating centers. If your child care facility participates in CACFP, your child can receive free meals while in care.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program

This program is a federally funded program that helps supplement the diets of low-income Americans, including elderly people, by providing them with emergency food and nutrition assistance at no cost.

Commodity Senior Food Program

This program works to improve the health of low-income persons who are at least 60 years of age by supplementing their diets with a monthly package of nutritious food at no cost.
